## GETTING AROUND SUFFOLK

### Suffolk Transit

**Suffolk Transit** provides safe, cost-efficient fixed route transit services to Suffolk's core Downtown service area. It also provides fixed route transit services in the Northern Suffolk area as well as providing a connection from Downtown to HRT in the Chesapeake Square area before continuing on to the North Suffolk Library.

All day passes cost \$3 and one way trips cost \$1.50 per trip. Children 5 and under are free. ADA paratransit costs \$3 per one-way trip. The all day pass allows you to ride on any Suffolk Transit line. Tickets and passes may be purchased at the City of Suffolk Treasurer's office or by paying cash (exact change required) on the bus. Tickets and passes may also be purchased at the Virginia Regional Transit Office located at 139 E Washington Street, Suite A.

**Newport News-Williamsburg Airport (PHF)** provides air travel in and out of the 757 on American, Delta, United, and a handful of international carriers.

**Norfolk International Airport (ORF)** also serves the region, with flights on Allegiant, American, Breeze, Delta, Frontier, Southwest, United, and other airlines.

**Amtrak** provides a unique way to travel with the ability to explore at the same time. Hampton Roads has train stations in Norfolk, Newport News, and Williamsburg.

**Greyhound** is one of the largest intercity bus services in North America and has stops in Williamsburg, Virginia Beach, Norfolk, and Hampton. They also offer a 10% discount for students.
